- 1) Matthew 22:14 *"For many are called, but few are chosen."*
 - a. The Greek word for Church is Ekklesia meaning "to call out."
 - i. How is this term applied to the Church during this dispensation?
 - ii. How is this term applied to the Church at the Judgment Seat of Christ?

- 2) The Body of Christ
 - a. 1 Corinthians 12:12-27 *¹²For even as the body is one and yet has many members, and all the members of the body, though they are many, are one body, so also is Christ. ¹³For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. ¹⁴For the body is not one member, but many. ¹⁵If the foot says, "Because I am not a hand, I am not a part of the body," it is not for this reason any the less a part of the body. ¹⁶And if the ear says, "Because I am not an eye, I am not a part of the body," it is not for this reason any the less a part of the body. ¹⁷If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸But now God has placed the members, each one of them, in the body, just as He desired. ¹⁹If they were all one member, where would the body be? ²⁰But now there are many members, but one body. ²¹And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; or again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." ²²On the contrary, it is much truer that the members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary; ²³and those members of the body which we deem less honorable, on these we bestow more abundant honor,*

and our less presentable members become much more presentable, ²⁴whereas our more presentable members have no need of it. But God has so composed the body, giving more abundant honor to that member which lacked, ²⁵so that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. ²⁶And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it. ²⁷Now you are Christ's body, and individually members of it.

a. Adam and Eve

- i. Genesis 2:18, 21-23 *Then the LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him." ²¹So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then He took*

one of his ribs and closed up the flesh at that place.

²²The LORD God fashioned into a woman the rib which He had taken from the man, and brought her to the man. ²³The man said, "This is now bone of my bones, And flesh of my flesh; She shall be called Woman, Because she was taken out of Man."

2. Where was the woman taken out of?
3. How is this a picture of Christ and His Bride?

b. Isaac and Rebekah

- i. *Genesis 24:2-4 Abraham said to his servant, the oldest of his household, who had charge of all that he owned, "Please place your hand under my thigh, ³and I will make you swear by the LORD, the God of heaven and the God of earth, that you shall not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, among whom I live, ⁴but you will go to my country and to my relatives, and take a wife for my son Isaac."*

1. Who are the characters in this story a type of?

2. What were the stipulations the servant had for finding a bride?
3. Genesis 24:15-16 *Before he had finished praying, Rebekah came out with her jar on her shoulder. She was the daughter of Bethuel son of Milcah, who was the wife of Abraham's brother Nahor. ¹⁶ The girl was very beautiful, a virgin; no man had ever lain with her. She went down to the spring, filled her jar and came up again.*

 - b. What was the woman doing when the servant found her?
 - i. What is this a picture of?
 - c. Had the woman ever participated in sexual immorality?
