Part One
Study Questions

1). Read Genesis 1:3-5 – What do we see happening in these verses and what do we know about the light that is spoken into being?

a). Which verses did we look at that describe the appearance of God and what do we know about His relationship with the universe?

b). As glory and rulership go hand in hand what is significant about the light which we see on day 1 in Genesis and why must this be God's first sovereign act in the restoration of the ruined creation?

c). Which other scriptures did we look at that show the inseparable connection between glory and rulership and what might we learn from them?

d). Read Genesis 1:14-19 – According to our verses what are the sun, moon and stars for?

e). How are we to make sense of the sun and moon being 'made' if the light to divide day and night was already there?

f). Read Psalm 19:1-6 – Given what we have just been studying how would we want to understand what is said in these verses? And which other scripture did we look at in connection with this?

g). Read Genesis 1:26 – How do Adam and the Woman fit into this whole picture?

h). Which scripture did we look at that shows the end of God's purpose for Man?

i). What then are we to learn from each passing day and night and which scriptures did we look at in connection with this? Are there any others we might add to these?

j). Read Genesis 8:22 – What do we see in this verse and what should we learn from it?

k). What question does Peter ask in 2 Peter 3:11? What is the context of the question? How does what we are studying today help formulate our answer?

l). Read Psalms 72:19 – How does this tie in with all we are learning?

2). Read 1 Corinthians 1:22-24 – what do we learn from these verses and how do they connect with Genesis 1:14?

a). Which other 'signs' given to Israel?

b). How is the only way we can understand how the sun, moon and stars are used as signs?

c). Read Genesis 37:9 and Revelation 12:1 – explain what is pictured in these verses.

d). Any final thoughts?
