Study Questions

1). Read John 5:43 – exactly what is the Lord telling the Jews in this verse and how does this fit into what we know of the Tribulation?

a). Where else did we see this same truth prophetically pictured and what did we learn from this verse?

b). Where in the scriptures did we look to find the solution to Israel's situation and why is this the only way that they can find help?

c). Read Romans 11:29 – what does this verse tell us concerning Israel?

2). Read Leviticus 26:23-24 – what is the context in which we find these verses and how do they connect with what we know of the Great Tribulation?

a). Read Revelation 6:7-8 – where had the content of these verses already been prophetically laid out and which verses did we read that showed this to us?

b). What does all of this tell us with regards to God and His Word?

c). Keeping the answer to the previous question in mind read Leviticus 26:40-42 and 2 Chronicles 7:13-14 - What then can we say about the content of these verses?

d). What additional certainty can we have from the scriptures we have been studying concerning God's faithfulness to His Word and which scriptures did we look at in connection with it?

3). Read John 11:39 – What would we want to say about this verse given what we know of Israel's present state and what we are prophetically told in foundation concerning their future?

4). Read Romans 11:15 – who is Paul talking about in this verse?

a). Explain the words, 'cast away' and 'acceptance' in the context we find them.

b). What does the verse tell us is the outcome of Israel being 'cast away' and what does this mean?

c). What does the verse tell us is the outcome for Israel's 'acceptance'?

d). What is the only means by which Israel can be accepted?

e). What do we know about the present world system and are there any scriptures you can think of that show this?

f). What do we know about ourselves with respect to the present system?

g). From what we have looked at how should we begin to understand 'life' with respect to ourselves and the Millennial Kingdom?

h). What about the beyond the Millennium?

i). So, with all this in mind – why does God go to such extraordinary lengths to bring Israel to repentance?
