Study Questions

1). Read Numbers 35:31-32 – What does v31 have to say about the murderer and the ransom?

a). What difference do we see in v32 with respect to the ransom and the person who has fled to the city of refuge?

b). Under what circumstances can the ransom be used on behalf of the one who has fled to the city of refuge?

c). What would be the consequence for the one who had fled to the city of refuge once the ransom was accepted on his behalf?

d). In Numbers Chapter 35 is God dealing with Israel as a nation or with individual Jews?

e). When God deals with the antitype of Numbers Chapter 35 is He dealing with Israel as a nation or with individual Jews?

f). Which scripture did we look at that shows us who is responsible for the death of Christ?

g). What do Luke 23:34 and Acts 3:17 tell us about Israel's killing of Christ?

h). How should we understand Israel fleeing to a city of refuge in the antitype of Numbers Chapter 35?

i). Following Christ's death, when exactly did that pictured in fleeing to a city of refuge take place?

j). Read Numbers 35:26-28 – What then began to happen to Israel in 1948 and what would that mean for the Jewish people?

k). What will happen to Israel at the mid-point in the Tribulation and why?

l). Given that 2/3rds of the Jewish people will be killed during the second half of the Tribulation how should we understand them being in a place of refuge and what other scriptural examples do we have that show us this same thing?

l). What is pictured through the death of the high priest and when will this happen?

m). Because Israel killed Christ in ignorance what does this mean for the nation following 'the death of the high priest' within the context of the events seen in Numbers Chapter 35?

n). Read Hebrews 7:20-22 – What commentary do we see in these verses concerning the change in Priesthood following Christ's return to earth?

o). Between which 2 feasts will the new covenant with Israel be made and how do we know?

2). How will the Feast of Passover be fulfilled?

a). How will the Feast of Unleavened Bread be fulfilled?

b). Which Feast comes next and what does it have to do with?

3). Read Matthew 27:52-53 – What do we see happening in these verses and why is it happening?

a). What do we learn in these verses about the resurrection of these OT saints?

b). How is this different from that which will happen to Christians?

c). What will that which we see in Matthew 27 mean for the resurrection of all OT saints at First Fruits?

d). Read Matthew 17:1-3 – What is this section of scripture all about and who is present in it?

e). What would we know about the physical condition of Peter, James and John when this takes place?

f). Who might Peter, James and John picture for us in this event and how would this connect with Matthew 27?

g). How is it possible for resurrected OT saints and redeemed Israel to go through the Millennial Kingdom and into eternity in bodies of flesh, bone and blood?

h). So, broadly speaking, what do we know about the location of the graves of OT saints?

i). Having been resurrected what will all these OT saints have to do?

j). Read Joshua 24:32 – Given what we have just studied what do we now know about Joseph?

k). Read Exodus 13:19 – Explain the typology that we see in this verse and what does it mean for the re-gathering of Israel?

l). Read Daniel 12:13 – according to that which we see in this verse what is intimately connected with the resurrection of OT saints?

m). What about those OT saints, like the first generation to come out of Egypt, who have not been faithful, and which scripture did we look at in connection with this?

4). Read Acts 2:14-16 – What is happening at this point and how does Peter explain it?

a). Why would Joel's prophecy not be fulfilled at this time?

b). When will Joel's prophecy be fulfilled and what does his prophecy say?

c). What do you think is being described in Joel 2:25?

d). What do you think is being promised in v26-27?

e). Look at v 28 again – after what will He pour out His Spirit on all flesh?
