Study Questions

1). Heb 11:3 *By faith we understand that the worlds [ages] were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.* What do we know about the ages that ‘were framed by the word of God’?

a). What scriptures did we look at in connection with this?

b). With respect to the coming Kingdom of Christ what is the unalterable pattern that God has set in place?

c). What does this unalterable pattern have to do with and what does Peter have to say about it?

d). What takes place towards the end of the 6th day in the Genesis account and what do the scriptures have to say about this?

e). What do we learn from this with regards to the end of the 6000th year?

f). Which OT character is used to picture the rapture of the church?

2). Read Genesis 5:21-27

a). According to the scripture what happened when Enoch was 65 years old?

b). According to the scripture what happened following this event?

c). What might we conclude from these two things?

d). What does the name 'Methuselah' mean?

e). What does the 'it' in Methuselah's name refer to and how would we know?

f). What then might we conclude that God revealed to Enoch?

g). What can we know about the way Enoch conducted his life following this?

3). Where do we find a prophecy given by Enoch and what does it say?

a). What does the scripture say about prophecy?

b). What would this tell us then about the prophecy of Enoch?

c). What is significant about this prophecy being recorded in the Book of Jude and about whom does it speak in this context?

d). How are these individuals described in Jude?

e). How are they described in Peter?

f). How are they described in Hebrews?

g). What basically have these individuals done?

h). What awaits these Christians and what does Peter point to, to show the certainty of this?

i). When will this judgment take place and who is it that pictures this very event?

j). What do you think about the way that God has put this all together?

4). Read Hebrews 10:36-39 – What is the promise given in these verses?

a). How is our experience then similar to that of Enoch?

b). What impact should this have on the way we live now?

c). What if we are still clinging to the things of this world?

5). Read Romans 13:10-14 – what does this teach us?

a). What does Hebrews 12:1-2 have to say about this?

b). Do you have any final thoughts on Enoch?

6). *7 By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness which is according*

to faith. – What does this verse teach us about Noah and what application is there here for ourselves?

a). What kind of righteousness does this verse speak of?

b). How many generations was Noah from Adam and why is this significant?

7). Read the beginning of the account of Noah in Genesis 5:25-32 – What is the relationship between Noah and Methuselah and Enoch?

a). According to the scripture why did Lamech give his son the name Noah and what would his statement be a reference to?

b). Why might Lamech make a statement like this about his son?

c). What does the name ‘Noah’ mean?

d). What would be significant about this name?

e). Does the extent of the revelation given to these individuals from the lineage of Seth surprise you?

8). Read Genesis 6:1-2 – What began to happen?

a). When did it begin to happen and why did it begin to happen?
