Study Questions

1). What is the content of Genesis Chapters 21-25 and what do these chapters provide types of?

a). Why does Christ not need to return to the earth to help procure His own Bride?

b). What scripture did we look at with respect to that which Christ has already provided for His Bride?

2). Ge 24:13 *"Behold, here I stand by the well of water, and the daughters of the men of the city are coming out to draw water.*

a). What do you notice about the well of water in this verse?

b). Who else finds their bride by a well of water?

c). Read Genesis 29:10 – do Jacob's actions remind you of anything in the gospel accounts?

d). With regards to the type of where the oldest servant finds Rebekah, what does this teach us about the antitype?

3). There is another intriguing encounter with a woman by a well of water in John Chapter 4 – Read verses 3-10.

a). Where has Jesus come from? Where is he going to? And what does He need to do in order to get there?

b). What does this picture for us?

c). What is particular about the well of water where we find Him?

d). What does He ask the Samaritan woman and where have we heard a similar question before?

e). In v10 what 2 specific things does He speak to the woman about?

f). What would the overall scope of these 2 things encompass? And what scripture did we look at in John Chapter 4 in connection with this?

g). What details are we given about the woman and the timing of the meeting and what might this picture for us?

h). In v10 Jesus makes the statements ‘if you knew’ and ‘you would have asked’ – what do these statements remind us of?

i). How does our own personal experience fit into this picture?

4). Read John 4:39-43 – What did the Samaritans urge Him to do?

a). What is significant about this?

b). What reason do the Samaritans give for believing the Lord?

c). What scriptures does the reason the Samaritans give remind us of?

d). Do you have any comments to make on this encounter with the Samaritan woman?

e). When does Jesus return to Cana of Galilee?

f). What had already taken place at Cana and what is this a picture of?

g). Read John 4:46 – What does Jesus find on His return to Cana?

h). What does this picture for us and what OT scriptures did we look at in connection with this?

i). What does Jesus leaving Samaria after 2 days picture for us and how is this same event pictured in Genesis Chapter 24?

5). Read Genesis 24:61-67 – What is pictured for us in v61?

a). What distinguishes Rebekah from her maids and what does this picture?

b). What other scriptures should we look at in connection with this?

c). Genesis Chapter 24 comes to a close at the same point in time pictured in Christ leaving Samaria – How is this same picture presented in the Matthew 13 parables and what is the first parable given after this event has taken place and what does this parable have to do with?

6). Read Genesis 25:1 – How is the same event we have just been looking at presented at the beginning of this Chapter? And what scripture did we look at in connection with it?

a). What is significant about the name Keturah and what does this teach us?

b). What has been the focus of all the events we have just been looking at?

c). Read Hebrews 11:20 – How does this verse connect to the same focus?

d). When Isaac acts by faith, what is it faith with respect to and what did God say to him personally about it?

e). Esau and Jacob were twins – who was considered the elder and what would this mean for him?

f). What had God told Rachel before the twins' birth and what is significant about it?

g). What is the scriptural reason given for Esau selling his birthright and what does this mean?

h). Do you have any thoughts on Jacob's actions?
