Study Questions

1). Heb 11:29 *By faith they passed through the Red Sea as by dry land, whereas the Egyptians, attempting to do so, were drowned. 30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they were encircled for seven days.*

a). What had we learned about the tactics of our enemy during the time gap between these verses and what was his purpose?

b). Read 2 Timothy 4:2-4 – What do these verses teach us about the relationship between our desires and sound doctrine?

c). What do you think this would mean with regards to the spiritual warfare?

d). What do the scriptures teach us about overcoming our enemy's deception?

e). What would this mean for us in practical terms?

2). From a prophetic viewpoint what event do our 2 verses from Hebrews 11 refer to?

a). What promise to Abraham do these verses look to with regards to a future fulfillment?

b). Explain how this promise to Abraham will be fulfilled by this event?

c). As well as looking forward these verses also look back to foundation – to where do they look and what is the promise contained in these verses?

d). What is made certain by God's declaration at the foundation?

3). Read Joshua 6:1-5 – how are Jericho and Egypt the same?

a). What instructions does God give to Joshua and Israel with regards to 6 days and a 7<sup>th</sup> day?

b). What is pictured in the 6 days?

c). What was already certain before Israel's first circuit of the city and what other evidence do we have for this?

d). Again, what does this picture for us?

e). How does Hebrews 11:30 tell us Israel conducted themselves at Jericho?

f). When did they have this faith?

g). What other events have we looked at that provide a picture of the same conclusion we see at Jericho?

h). Why do you think there are so many examples of this?

4). Read Daniel 2:37-45 – what is pictured in these verses?

a). As well as the description of this image what else does God give us through Daniel that pertains to this?

b). What conclusion can we draw from all of this?

5). Read Exodus 4:22-23 – Exactly what is being said here and to whom is it being said?

a). How important is this declaration would you say?

b). What should we understand about Pharaoh in this context?

c). What does this picture for us?

d). What circumstances result in Moses being sent back to Egypt?

e). What 2 things is he sent back to do?

f). Where would we find the picture of the Tribulation in the Exodus account?

g). What do the 10 plagues upon Egypt picture and how would we know?

h). What does the 10<sup>th</sup> and final plague have to do with and how does this connect with what we studied earlier?

i). Which scripture did we look at in connection with this?

j). What is the cumulative effect of the 10 plagues?

k). What is the climactic conclusion that follows these 10 plagues and what does this mean?

6). Read Exodus 40:33-45 – Explain what happens here?

a). How remarkable is this?

b). How long did the historical Theocratic Kingdom continue and what caused its demise?

c). What happened at this terminal point for the historical Kingdom?

d). What period of time began at this point and how does it connect with Daniel's image?

e). What does Jesus have to say about this period of time in Luke's Gospel?

f). When and how does God make His intentions clear concerning 'the times of the Gentiles'?

g). In Daniel's 70 week prophecy who is center stage and who is the main protagonist?

h). What does the juxtaposition of these two picture for us?

i). Who will have the major role in the events pictured here?

7). Where are we now in terms of time with regards to the imagery surrounding Jericho?
