Study Questions

1). Heb 11:29 *By faith they passed through the Red Sea as by dry land, whereas the Egyptians, attempting to do so, were drowned. 30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they were encircled for seven days.* Which future event do these verses typify and what do they teach us about this event?

2) Read Daniel 2:31-35 – How many kingdoms altogether are presented in these verses?

a). What/Who does the head of gold represent and how would we know?

b). What is the danger of trying to make this image fit within an historical chronology?

c). If not history then how should we see it and what do we need to do to make sense of it?

3). Read Genesis 11:1-9 – What is this a foundational type for?

a). Explain the various types that we see here.

- b). What are the two first mention principles presented in these verses?
- c). Who is Nimrod and what might we know about him?
- d). What then does the Babylonian connection teach us about Daniel's image?
- e). When was Nebuchadnezzar's dream given to him and what were the circumstances by which Daniel was able to interpret it?
- f). Does Israel's captivity here remind you of an event we have studied previously?
- g). What happened to the kingdom of Israel following the death of Solomon?
- h). Where and when did Israel's captivity start and which scripture did we look at in connection with this?
- i). In what way is the disobedience of the northern and the southern tribes pictured in Ezekiel?
- j). When did the captivity of the southern tribes begin and what brought this to completion?
- k). What did God tell Jeremiah about the captivity of Israel in Babylon?
- l). What did God tell Daniel about this when Daniel inquired about it and why is this significant?
- m). What do we know about the chronology that God gave to Daniel?

n). What do we know about the remaining 7 years from Daniel's prophecy?

4). Read Psalm 2:1-4 and Psalm 83:2-5 – What is the stated purpose of the Gentile nations as seen in these two Psalms?

a). What begins the final 7 years and what does Daniel 11 have to say about the actions of Antichrist?

b). From what we have seen in the types and in foundation what do we know about Antichrist?

c). How should we view the many in Israel making covenant with this man?

d). What similarities do we see in this with Israel's past behavior?

5) Read Revelation 6:1-2 – What is contained in and on the 7 sealed scroll?

a). What does the opening of the first seal denote and what event would be concurrent with this?

b). Who is the rider of the white horse?

c). What does the color of the horse tell us?

d). What is this man's intention and how does he go about it?

e). What one particular characteristic does he share with his father?

f). How long does this mode of operation continue?

6). Read Revelation 6:3-4 – Who is the rider of the fiery red horse?

a). What has now changed and why?

b). How does what happens here connect with the beginning of the times of the Gentiles?

c). What does the Lord have to say to those who will be in Israel when this happens?

d). What will happen to those who don't heed His warning?

e). How does this connect with Daniel's image?

f). What do our verses in Revelation 6 say is taken from the earth and what will people do to each other?

g). Why would this be?

h). What does Daniel have to say about the rider on the fiery red horse?

i). What commentary does Joel give on these events?

j). Do you have any thoughts on all of this?
