Study Questions

1). Mt 6:13 *And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one.*

For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

- a). According to our verse why should the Lord not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one?
- b). What does the statement 'Yours is the Kingdom' tell us?
- c). What do we see in Genesis that shows this to be so?
- d). What was the purpose for God creating this Kingdom and how would we know?
- e). Whom did He place as the first or original ruler of this province and what does the scripture record about him?
- f). What happened to this ruler subsequently and what position do we find him in today?

2). Read Psalms 2:5-9 – Who is identified as the One to replace Satan?

- a). Has this always been God's plan and how would we know?

b). So why Satan?

c). Read Genesis 1:26-28 – What do these verses teach us about rulership and God's Son?

d). In order for God to provide a Bride for His Son what did He do?

e). What is unique about this creation and how would we know?

f). Considering our existence in the present time what would we say about it in relation to God's purpose?

g). Wherein will we find lasting joy and contentment and why would this be so?

h). How is this to be played out in our day to day existence?

3). Read Genesis 2:7 – What happened to cause Adam to become a living being?

a). How should we understand the life imparted to Adam and then to the Woman and what did it mean for them?

b). What did God warn Adam and the Woman about?

c). What happened as a result of the Woman being deceived?

d). Did Adam and the Woman cease to exist at this point?

e). So what died?

- f). What does this mean for all those naturally born after Adam?
 - g). How does being dead in trespasses and sins equate with the condition of Adam after he was formed from the dust of the ground?
 - h). What is the only solution to our spiritual deadness?
 - i). Can you describe what happened to us at the moment of our eternal salvation?
 - j). Read Ephesians 2:1-9 – What do these verses teach us with respect to our eternal salvation?
- 4). Read John 3:6 – In what ways are we now in the image and likeness of God and in what ways are we still separate from them?
- a). Why does our body still grow old and eventually die?
 - b). What might we learn from this with regards to our soul?
 - c). Read Genesis 1:3-4 – what good news do we find in these verses?
 - d). Read 2 Corinthians 5:17 – what does this verse teach us and what would you say is significant about this?
 - e). If we are a 3 part being must salvation encompass all 3 parts?
 - f). What has God set in place with regards to the salvation of the soul?

g). Read Romans 12:1-3 – What do these verses teach us about this salvation?

h). How should we understand being a living sacrifice and which scriptures did we look at in connection with this?

i). What 2 things are we then to do in conjunction with this?

j). What OT example did we look at and which scriptures did we look at?

k). What do we know about the word translated ‘transformed’ as seen in Romans 12 and 2 Corinthians 11?

5). Read Hebrews 4:12 – What does this teach us about the Word of God and what does this mean? Which scriptures did we look at in connection with this?

a). What can we conclude then about the ‘life’ we have received and the ‘life we are to continue to receive?

b). What if we refuse to receive this ‘life’?

c). Which scriptures did we look at that describe this exact same process of receiving ‘life’?

d). What does Hebrews 4:2 teach us about the nation of Israel and why is this important to our understanding of receiving ‘life’?

6). Read 1 Corinthians 2:12-13 – what do you note about how and what is taught as we see in these verses?

a). What does the next verse in 1 Corinthians 2 tell us and what does this mean?

b). What if we rely on the sufficiency of our own intellect to understand the scriptures?
