Study Questions

- 1). Read Matthew 6:9-13 – What context does the Lord set in v9-10?
 - a). What time period does He then take us to in v11-13?
 - b). What does He show us to be most important during this time?

- 2). Read Psalm 78:19-25 – What questions does Israel ask of God?
 - a). What do these verses tell us God actually did for them?
 - b). What do the verses record was Israel's problem and what was God's reaction to that?
 - c). What corroboration do we find in Hebrews Chapter 4 for this?

- 3). *of the bread of heaven* – What instructions did God give Moses for the building of the earthly Tabernacle?
 - a). Where would we find bread in Moses Tabernacle?
 - b). What would this tell us about bread in the heavenly Tabernacle?
 - c). How do we see Christ in the earthly Tabernacle?
 - d). What might we conclude then about the manna rained upon Israel?

- e). What do we find Jesus saying about Himself with regards to this?
- f). What does 1 Corinthians 10:3 tell us?
- g). What is the spiritual food and of whom is it a type?
- h). Who is the spiritual drink and of whom is it a type?

4). Read John 6:51 and John 7:37-39 – How do these verses show us God replicating His dealings with Israel in the wilderness at Christ’s first advent?

- a). What event does ‘The last day, that great day of the feast’ take us to?
- b). What do you know about the Feast of Tabernacles?
- c). Historically, what did the priests do for the first 7 days of this feast?
- d). What was this done in remembrance of?
- e). What happened on the 8th day of the feast?
- f). What was this looking forward to?
- g). What does Isaiah Chapter 12 have to say about this Day?
- h). What additional scripture from Isaiah did we look at?
- i). How is Jesus on that particular day fulfilling that recorded in Isaiah?
- j). What was Israel’s reaction to this?
- k). What is the division based upon and how is this the same as Israel in

the wilderness?

5). Read John 6:51-53 – How is Jesus the literal answer to the questions asked by Israel in the wilderness recorded in Psalm 78?

a). In what way is what we see here the same as what we saw in John Chapter 7?

b). What was the Jews reaction to that in John 6?

c). What was the reaction of ‘many’ of His disciples?

d). What is the reason for both reactions?

e). How does this parallel the experience of Israel in the wilderness?

f). *From that time many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more.* What does this verse tells and where in the NT Epistles can we find verses that relate to this?

6). Read John 6:67-69 – What question does the Lord ask the 12?

a). What does Peter reply and what should we understand from what he says?

b). What might we learn here for ourselves?

c). From all we now know, why would you say the Lord has us focus on ‘Give us this day our daily bread’ – and which scriptures did we look at in connection with this?

7). How should we understand the concept of 'our daily bread' and which scripture did we look at to see this?

a). Which scripture did we look at with regards to Israel that parallels our experience in the present?

b). Which other scripture did we look at in connection with this?

c). According to the warning in Hebrews we looked at, what will prevent us hearing His voice/receiving our daily bread?

d). What had happened to the original recipients of the letter to the Hebrews and how would we know?

e). What should we learn from this for ourselves?

f). What is the key to understanding what happened to Israel in the wilderness, the original recipients of Hebrews, and what could happen to us, and what does Hebrews 2:1 have to say about it?

g). Finally, what encouragement do we find in the words of the Lord to us in Matthew 5 and Luke 11?
