Study Questions

1). Read Hebrews 3:5-14 – How do these verses fit with our understanding of our ‘daily’ bread?

a). What do v7-8 tell us is essential to our becoming part of His house and holding the beginning of our confidence steadfast until the end?

b). *hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm to the end and hold the beginning of our confidence steadfast to the end* - What is the first thing necessary for us if we are to accomplish this?

c). Which scripture did we look at that describes our hope?

d). What is the second thing we are to do once we know and understand this? How is this possible?

2). Read 2 Timothy 3:13-17 – What contrast is given in v13-14?

a). What does this contrast demonstrate has existed for Christians throughout this dispensation?

b). Who is the perpetrator of this and why is he doing it?

c). Where do we find this being prophesied and what does it say?

d). What does Peter say about this same thing?

c). Which other Book in particular details this activity?

d). What do we know of Balaam in the OT?

e). Where and in what context is he mentioned in the NT?

f). What should we learn from this for ourselves?

3). What did Paul tell Timothy in 2 Timothy 3:14?

a). From whom have we learned the truth and which scripture did we look at in connection with this?

b). How is this accomplished according to 1 Corinthians Chapter 2?

c). Which other scripture did we look at in connection with this?

d). In what way then are we to receive 'our daily bread' and which scriptures did we look at?

e). Which scripture did we look at that might help us voice this in prayer?

4). Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 – How should we understand the Lord's Supper with respect to Israel?

a). How should we understand it with respects to ourselves?

4). Read Matthew 6:12 – What is necessary for this to be possible?

a). What direct correlation do we see in this verse?

b). What and where does Jesus add to this?

c). What 2 important things might we conclude from these verses?

d). Read 1 John 1:6-10 – do you think v9 contradicts that which we read in John Chapter 6? Who is the author of both?

e). What place does the imagery in these verses take us to?

f). What does our cleansing have to do with?

g). Where would this place us and what would we have had to do first?

h). If we do not forgive our debtors what is this?

i). Where would this have to be dealt with?

j). Who is forgiving others an issue between?

k). What if we should refuse to do this?

l). What then is forgiveness and which scriptures did we look at in connection with this?

5) Read Matthew 18:23-35 – What does the opening of this parable tell us and which other parables come to mind?

- a). Who is the only One who can forgive sin?
- b). What does our forgiving others have to do with then?
- c). What debt would we owe the Lord and where does this debt come from?
- d). How should we understand those who trespass against us owing us a debt?
- e). Where does this debt come from?
- f). What is the point of the contrast between the 10,000 talents and the 100 denarii?
- g). What are the consequences for the servant who does not forgive his fellow servant? What does this translate to?
- h). Does forgiving our fellow servant cleanse him from his sin? How should we understand this?
- i). Which other scriptures did we look at that show the importance of our forgiving one another?
- j). Any final thoughts?
