Study Questions

1). Ps 22:21 *Save Me from the lion's mouth And from the horns of the wild oxen!*

*You have answered Me.*

Joh 19:30 *So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "It is finished!" And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit.*

Joh 10:17 *"Therefore My Father loves Me, because I lay down My life that I may take it again. 18 "No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This command I have received from My Father."*

a). Describe the connection between these three scriptures.

b). As you consider these things what impact do they have on you personally?

2). 1Co 15:44 *It is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body.*

a). What does this scripture teach us and how would we relate it to Christ in His resurrection?

3). What do you know about the place known as ‘Tartarus’?

a). Why do you think we need to know about this?

b). What do we know about the words translated, ‘hell’ and why might this be important for us?

4). What promise is made in Genesis 3:15 and what is significant about it?

a). Ge 6:1 ¶ *Now it came to pass, when men began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born to them, 2 that the sons of God saw the daughters of men, that they were beautiful; and they took wives for themselves of all whom they chose.*

b). What does the first verse above tell us about the timing of the sons of God cohabiting with the daughters of men?

c). What would be the importance of this timing and what was its purpose?

d). Ge 6:5 *Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.*

6 ¶ *And the LORD was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart.*

e). In the light of what we have just been looking at how would you now explain v5-6 above?

5). Ge 5:21 ¶ *Enoch lived sixty-five years, and begot Methuselah. 22 After he begot Methuselah, Enoch walked with God three hundred years, and had sons and daughters. 23 So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. 24 And Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him.*

a). What is significant here about Enoch and where would we go to find extra information about him?

b). Why do we need to know this?

c). How long did Methuselah live and what happened in the last year of his life?

d). Ge 6:9 *This is the genealogy of Noah. Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations. Noah walked with God.*

e). What does this scripture tell us and what are the implications?

6). Following the flood does the action of the fallen angels cease?

a). What seems to be their focus following the flood?

b). What promise does God make to Abraham and what would this tell us about the actions of the fallen angels from this point forward?

c). Does this promise remind you of anything we have seen earlier?

d). Ge 19:5 *And they called to Lot and said to him, "Where are the men who came to you tonight? Bring them out to us that we may know them carnally."*

e). Explain in as much detail as possible what we may know based on this scripture.

7). Ex 4:22 *"Then you shall say to Pharaoh, 'Thus says the LORD: 'Israel is My son, My firstborn.*

a). Exactly what is God saying in this statement and what would be significant about it from Satan's perspective?

b). Nu 13:33 *"There we saw the giants (the descendants of Anak came from the giants);*

c). From our scripture above what would you say was Satan's response to God's statement?

d). De 7:2 *"and when the LORD your God delivers them over to you, you shall conquer them and utterly destroy them. You shall make no covenant with them nor show mercy to them.*

e). Why is God's command here so drastic?

f). What would be the implications for not following through on this?

8). Lu 17:26 *"And as it was in the days of Noah, so it will be also in the days of the Son of Man: .....28 "Likewise as it was also in the days of Lot:*

a). What do these two statements tell us and what would this mean?

9). 1Pe 3:19 *by whom also He went and preached to the spirits in prison,*

a). Explain the significance of what this verse teaches us.

b). Given the historical context for Peter's letter why do you think the Holy Spirit makes reference to this event?
