Study Questions

1). Read Galatians 3:22-29 – What distinction is being made between the law and faith in these verses?

a). What would you say is the difference between law and faith?

b). When did faith come?

c). What came by faith?

d). In whom is that which came by faith found?

e). What was the purpose and the timeframe for the law and which scripture shows that to us?

f). The promise by faith in Jesus Christ is to be given to those who believe – how must we understand the use of the word ‘believe’ in this context?

g). How should we understand faith being revealed and which scripture did we look at in connection with this?

h). Read Galatians 3:17-18 – what is taught concerning the promise and the law in these verses?

i). To what promise are our scriptures referring and where is one of the places where we can see the details of the promise? What would you say is most significant in these verses?

j). In which 2 places do we find further commentary on the promise given to Abraham and what do we learn from these additional verses?

k). Which 2 distinct groups form the seed of Abraham and which scripture did we look at in connection with this?

2). Read Galatians 3:16 – What is taught in this verse?

a). How can we reconcile the seed of Abraham in the plural which we looked at earlier with the Seed of Abraham in the singular, being Christ, and which scripture did we look at concerning this?

b). Read Psalm 2:5-9 – How does what we see here connect with Galatians 3:16?

c). What do we learn from the verses of this Psalm?

d). Which day is referred to in this Psalm and where do we find it in foundation?

e). What other promise do we find in connection with the 7<sup>th</sup> Day in foundation that provides the basis for the promise to Abraham?

f). Putting all this together what can we know about the Christ and which scripture did we look at in connection with this?

3). Read Galatians 3:29-4:7 – What do we learn in v29?

a). What do we learn about children and heirs in the verses that follow?

b). How would we see the Law in this context and what would this teach us about Israel?

c). What happened with respect to this at Christ's first advent?

d). Read 4:3 again – what do we learn from this?

e). Read 4:4-5 again – What do we understand about the phrase 'the fullness of the time'?

d). What happened at this precise moment in time?

e). What do we know from the phrase 'God sent forth'?

f). What does it mean that Christ was 'born of a woman'?

g). What does it mean that He was born under law?

h). Where have we seen the coming of the fullness of the time in a previous scripture?

i). Where is this same scripture quoted in Hebrews?

j). What did we see was the context for the coming of this day and what do we know from Peter about it?

k). So, what must we conclude from this about Christ's birth, death, resurrection and ascension and which scripture did we look at concerning this?

l). What is the 'divine paradox' that we encounter here?

4). Read Daniel 9:24-26 – what do these verses tell us about the fullness of the time?

a). What is the whole timeframe for the events shown in these verses?

b). Once again, what should we learn from this about Christ's first advent?

c). What does John 18:36-37 tell us about this?

5). Read Deuteronomy 18:18-22 – What do we learn from these verses?

a). Read Malachi 4:4-5 and Luke 1:13-17 – how might we connect these 2 sets of scripture with that which we read in Deuteronomy?

b). To whom did the angel speak as recorded in Luke and what is significant about this?

- c). Who was John the Baptist's mother and what is significant about her?
- d). Was John Elijah?
- e). What then would this tell us with regards to our verses from Malachi?
- f). What would this mean then for the events about to transpire in Jesus' life?
- g). Read Hebrews 1:1-2 and Matthew 17:5 – what connection can we make here with Deuteronomy 18?
- h). All in all then, what is the most significant thing that you have learned from this study?
