Study Questions

1). Read Hebrews 11:4-10 – What foundational, panoramic picture do these verses provide for us?

a). Where does the writer of Hebrews draw from in relating the events recorded in these verses?

b). What then is the expectation with regards to the reader and these verses?

c). Which other OT scripture did we look at in connection with this and what does it teach us?

d). Being very simple, what are the events set out in our panoramic picture?

e). What is the interpretation of this picture?

f). What irrevocable truth is also set out in this sequence of events?

g). Read Isaiah 46:9-10 – What is the significance of these verses?

2). Read Genesis 4:1-8 – What connection can we make between these verses and that which we just read from Isaiah?

b). What occupations do Cain and Abel have and what might be significant in that?

c). By comparing scripture with scripture what is the difference between Cain's offering and Abel's offering?

d). What then can we know for certain about Cain and Abel and the offering they were to bring?

e). Which scripture did we look at for commentary with respect to Cain?

f). What counsel does God give Cain? What is Cain's response and what is the ultimate conclusion of his response?

g). What does the account of these 2 brothers give us the foundational type for?

h). In which verse from Genesis Chapter 4 do we find the promise of ultimate redemption for Cain and Israel?

i). Which scriptures did we look at in connection with Israel and this promise?

3). Read Genesis 4:10-15 – What is the consequence of Cain’s unbelief that leads to the killing of his brother?

a). What does God promise Cain?

b). What foundational truth do we find here with respect to Israel?

c). What is consistently true for Israel that we can see through the Book of Judges?

d). What does Israel’s consistent unbelief ultimately result in following the historical kingdom being divided after the death of Solomon?

e). So where is Israel during this historical time?

f). Is this the first time we see Babylon in the scriptures?

g). Where do we first see a reference to Babylon and what do we know about the first king of Babylon?

h). How are Nimrod’s actions similar to that seen with Satan?

i). How is the connection between this geographical area and Israel continued in the days of Moses?

j). What do we know from history about the Pharaoh of Moses’s day?

k). Putting all this together, what is the unchangeable truth that is being set in place?

4). Read Daniel 9:24-27 – When was this prophecy written?

a). What is laid out for us in these verses?
