1). Read Genesis 5:21-29 – What does Enoch provide the foundational picture of?

a). What do we know from the scriptures about Enoch's walking with God?

b). What is significant about the birth of Methuselah with regards to Enoch's faith?

c). What is significant about Methuselah's death?

d). Where do we find a prophecy given by Enoch recorded?

e). Who is the subject of this prophecy and why is this remarkable?

f). What is the triple aspect of that pictured through Enoch?

g). What does all of this tell us about Enoch's faith?

h). What then should this mean for us?

2). Which OT saint comes next after Enoch in our panorama in Hebrews 11 and what is pictured through him?

- a). Read Revelation 5:7 – What is taking place here and what is the connection with that pictured through Noah?
- b). What is particularly significant about the account of Noah and his family and what promise is there in this for Israel?
- c). Where else in the scriptures do we see this same promise presented?
- 3). Read Revelation 6:1-4 – What do we see in these verses?
- a). What is pictured through the opening of the first 4 seals on the 7 sealed scroll?
- b). Where do we find that pictured by the rider on the white horse in the Book of Daniel?
- c). What marks the beginning of the Tribulation?
- d). Read Daniel 2:36-45 – What are these verses an account of?
- e). How are these same kingdoms presented in Daniel Chapter 7?
- f). What is the most important thing to understand with respect to these kingdoms?
- g). How does this connect with that which we have previously seen with Nimrod and Pharaoh?
- h). What do we know of the first 3 kingdoms in history?

i). What then can we know about the fourth kingdom in the future and which scripture did we look at in connection with this?

j). How is Antichrist described in Revelation 13:2?

k). What does he do in the middle of Daniel's 70th week and how is this described in 2 Thessalonians?

l). What did the Lord have to say about this?

m). Which scriptures did we look at that describe the extent of Israel's persecution?

n). Why is this persecution so intense?

o). What do the scriptures tell us is the reason for this persecution?

p). What did God promise Cain in Genesis 4:14 and what would this mean for the Gentile nations persecuting Israel?

q). Which scripture describes what happens to the Gentile nations?

r). Because of this what must be the ultimate end for Gentile world power and where do we see this in a foundational type?

s). What does the Lord have to say about this in Isaiah Chapter 14?

t). How is the totality of the destruction of Gentile world power described in Revelation 14 and Revelation 19?

u). how does the final outcome for the image in Nebuchadnezzar's dream parallel this?

v). What do these events bring to a close and usher in?

w). How does this connect with the 4th of our OT saints from Hebrews 11?

4). What promise to Abraham will now be fulfilled?

a). How does that which we see pictured through Abraham apply to Israel and the 'Church'?

b). How does all of this take us back to where we started in the first part of our study?

c). Read Hebrews 11:7-8 – what should we learn from these verses for ourselves?

d). Read Hebrews 11:13-16 – What will you choose today?
