Study Questions

1). As we read and study the Matthew 13 parables we realize that we must see ourselves within them. What have you learned from our study of these parables that has most impacted you?

2). Read Matthew 13:49-50 – How should we explain the ‘wicked’ and the ‘just’ in these verses?

a). What is the outcome for the wicked as seen in these verses?

b). Where else do we see this exact same outcome?

c). What are the different ways that this same outcome for this same group are presented in the scriptures we looked at on Sunday and where do we find them?

d). So, are the things we see here to be taken literally and how would we know?

e). Read Genesis 19:29-30 and Genesis 19:27 – How do these verses help us with our understanding of this?

f). Does this make missing out on being the Bride of Christ less of an issue?

g). Read John 15:1-6 – What do we see and what do we learn from these verses?

h). Read 2 Thessalonians 1:5-10 – What do we see and what do we learn from these verses?

i). Read Hebrews 6:7-9 – What do we see and what do we learn from these verses?

j). Read Hebrews 10:26-31 – What do we see and what do we learn from these verses?

k). Read Jude 20-23 – What do we see and what do we learn from these verses?

l). Taking all these verses together with the verses we looked at in answer to c) above, what is the clear teaching of scripture and what does this say to you?

m). Why is unfruitfulness such a big deal and why do you think the Lord draws so much attention to the outcome for being unfruitful?

3). If you had to briefly explain what ‘the word of the kingdom’ is, what would you say?

a). What are the positives for hearing and believing the word of the kingdom?
