Study Questions

1). According to the Lord's explanation of the 4<sup>th</sup> part of the parable of the sower what makes those in this group different from the previous 3?

a). Read Matthew 13:8 – How should we account for the differing amounts of fruit that are produced by those in the good ground and what are your thoughts on this?

b). Read John 12:24, John 15:1-8 – What can we learn from these verses about the production of fruit?

c). Look at John 15:1-8 again – are there any other verses that we could look at in connection with this? Can you make any connection with the foundation in Genesis?

d). Read Galatians 5:19-26 – what do we learn from these verses and can you make a connection between them and the verses we just looked at from John?

e). Read Ruth 2:15-17 – What do these verses tell us about producing fruit?

2). Read Matthew 13:24-30 – what is the connection between this parable and the parable that has come before it?

a). Explain the phrase, ‘the kingdom of heaven has become like’.

b). If we go back to the beginning of the dispensation of the Church what is the parable of the wheat and tares describing and what scriptures do we have that show this?

c). Are tares amongst the wheat still possible today and why would you say so?

d). Why are the ‘good seeds’ called ‘the sons of the kingdom’?

e). What one thing do you think would be important for someone to take from this study?
